
# **STUDENT SUPPORT SERVICES**

- Students have been diligent about redeeming their points which demonstrates their continued buy-in to the Hero Program.


### **HERO Target Behaviors (Top 5)**

The percentages represent the behaviors that are being tracked NOT compliance.




### **Tardy to School Data**

There has been a decrease in the number of teachers tracking students that are meeting academic expectations.





### **April Suspensions**

#### **HUMAN RESOURCES**

The Human Resources Department is currently working diligently with Little Bird, a 3rd party HR auditing company, to ensure that our department is compliant. On April 29 we held the second installment of our Career Fest Open House and despite the large amount of RSVP's received prior to the event we had only 22 individuals in attendance. Nevertheless we had an eventful morning filled with networking, tours and discussions, giving candidates a true feel of the passion that we share here at WCHS. We are currently operating with 5 Teacher vacancies with 1 pending acceptance via the History Department. Certifications pending for this school year is currently holding at 9 but with August certificate expiration dates that may bring our number up to 15 pending certifications. Ms. Williams along with the HR department have begun to reach out to employees to incentivize updating their certifications prior to its expiration date. We will continue to work alongside teachers to assist them in getting their certification.

#### **ACCOUNTABILITY**

The Accountability Department is preparing for the Annual Report, Title I and Title II submissions, as well as the VADIR reports. In addition, the Department is looking into the Title III application, and is working with consultant Bryce Nielsen to obtain monies from the Walentas Grant.

### **FACILITIES/SAFETY**

#### **Facilities**

- 1. We have received new proposals and plans for the ventilation of Art Room 106 the work once approved is to commence in August 2017 and be ready for the upcoming school year
- 2. We have received a new proposal for review to enclose open space in Rooms 717 & 617 to allow for additional instructional space
- 3. We are preparing proposals for the repair of the stair handrailings. Many railing are loose and or broken and stripped screws causing the hand rails in areas to be loose
- 4. The school's flooring are in great condition stemming from a continuous maintenance plan. Unoccupied classrooms are being serviced on Saturdays when class use is limited
- 5. There have been no new issues to report with the FDNY, ECB, DOB or Heakth Departments

## **Safety**

- 1. There has been a spike in off school property incidents involving student physical altercations after dismissals. The NYPD has been notified and are monitoring the surrounding areas at school dismissals
- 2. There has been a report of two physical altercation in the school for the month
- 3. There has been a report of one staff member property loss / theft
- 4. We would like to propose to the Board to install 16 additional cameras in blind areas about the school that are in need of surveillance
- 5. There has been a report of one student arrest pertaining to alcohol & narcotics
- 6. There has been one report of an assault in the area regarding a Shelter client. One arrest was made (Non student staff involvement)
- 7. There has been no issues to date with the schools ADT Alarm system
- 8. All Safety Officer positions have been filled

#### **OPERATIONS**

The Operations team has focused on preparing for the year-end testing season. We prepared Regents Exam orders for June Regents, completed AP Exams 5/1-5/13, NYSESLAT Testing is in progress and STAR Testing Round 3 will begin on 5/26. We worked with the API and Instructional Coach to completed Cohort 2 of Teacher Video-taping PD and training. In addition, we are presently issuing Quarter 4 Progress Reports to parents. Finally, we are conducting Round 2 of Online Registration for 2017-18.
