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Risk Level Indicators

Schools will follow the [Center for Disease Control](#) and [local health department](#) recommendations for school closures and level of risk. The following are attempts to create risk levels in the absence of local closures and quarantines. [Johns Hopkins Outbreak Map](#)

Risk Level 1 (Low Risk)

- No School community cases of Coronavirus
- Very few reported cases of COVID-19 in NYC
- Some countries declare public health emergency (not the US)
- Airports implement informal screening mechanisms

Risk Level 2 (Moderate Risk)

- Limited cases of COVID-19 in NYC/NYS
- Travel advisories recommended by WHO, School, government
- No school students, families, faculty or staff identified with
- Average student attendance remains high 85-100%
- No advisories against non-essential travel to NY and NYC
- School, WHO, and/or regional health authorities declare a pandemic

Risk Level 3 (Medium Risk)

- Few COVID-19 cases within School community
- Increased community spread of COVID-19 in NYC
- Average student attendance below 80 – 90%
- Increasing evidence of potential restrictions on airline travel / other forms of international public transportation
- COVID-19 disease behavior or contagiousness changes to higher risk level

Risk Level 4 (High Risk)

- Spread of COVID-19 cases within the School community
- COVID-19 cases quickly increasing in the NYC Area rapidly increasing
- Government directs that schools be closed
- Evidence that hospitals are unable to manage or meet health care needs related to COVID-19
- Evidence of restricted airline travel or major travel restrictions

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- Staffing and attendance issues at School
- Home Learning Resources and Suggestions
- Use of Google Classroom or other
