- 1. There were no school visits from the Department of Health
- 2. One HVAC control board required a replacement for a heating unit on the 8th floor. All other units functional

- 1. There were five (5) student altercations three (3) on property and two (2) off property for the month. No serious injuries reported. Parent notifications, meetings and mediations were conducted to avoid further occurrences

One (1) Violation was issued for having three separate power strips charging school walkie-talkies (radios) as opposed to a single unit. A replacement power strip was ordered to replace the three
