
5 WAYS TO SUPPORT YOUR SCHOLAR FOR RETURN TO IN-PERSON LEARNING

with PLC Secretary Ms. Roxanne Liverpool



- 1. Acknowledge and validate feelings of fear. Talk to your scholar to see if they feel afraid or overwhelmed (covid, being around a large group of people again, etc.) The school has counselors to help talk to your scholar if they feel anxious. Please reach out for help.
- 2. Keep your own worries or anxieties in check. Our worries can become their worries.
- 3. If your scholar has not been going outside very much since the pandemic. Going outside again can feel strange. Start going for walks with your scholar. If your scholar takes public transportation to school. Take a trip on the bus or train before school starts.
- 4. When school starts in September. Go back to your old routine before the pandemic (wake up earlier, make breakfast, check bus or train schedule, etc.)
- 5. Be positive and give your scholar words of encouragement.

CITY JOBS

- New York City is the largest municipal government in the United States.
 More than 325,000 employees work at over 60 different agencies and offices.
- Many of these jobs do not require a college degree.
- Civil service law requires that candidates for most New York
- City jobs take and pass an exam before they can be hired

APPLYING FOR STATE JOBS

New York State Government provides rewarding career opportunities for individuals with a broad range of backgrounds. To join the state workforce, you will most likely have to take a civil service exam before applying for the position you're interested in. Applying for the specific position comes after you sign up, take and receive your exam results - a process that takes at least 90 days.

Most state jobs are divided into two categories – competitive and non-competitive.

Competitive Jobs (Exam Required):You must take and pass a civil service exam before applying for a competitive job.

Non-Competitive Jobs (No Exam Required):

You do not need to take an exam, but you must meet the qualifications of the position. These positions are generally filled by people with professional licenses, trade skills, or other specific qualifications.



- Must have no significant history of drug use
- Must be drug free at time of enlistment
- Must not have significant or offensive tattoos
- Must not have sole custody of dependents
- Must have had no significant legal issues and no issues outstanding





Japan Earthquake and Tsunami



The Navy mobilized 22 ships, 132 aircraft and over 15,000 personnel, delivering more than 260 tons of supplies, including emergency food and water.

California WildFires
