Planning for College starts in 9th grade

5 Ways to Have More College Options

1. Apply for scholarships in your junior year

There are millions upon millions of dollars of scholarship money up for grabs.

2. Apply early

Early decision means you plan to attend a school if your application is accepted; early action means you will find out the school's decision earlier.

3. Introduce yourself to admission officers

if your scholar is wait-listed at a school, sending a thoughtful e-mail about their interest in the school and what they can offer can go a long way.

4. Write a stellar admission essay

Your scholar should spend ample amount of time developing an admission essay that tell admission officers about them, the person, rather than themself, the student

5. Get outstanding letters of recommendation

Your scholar should act early if he/she knows what teacher they would like to write a letter of recommendation. This will give the teacher enough time to craft one.





What is Family Engagement?

Family Engagement is the shared responsibility of family members, schools, and communities. Family engagement is a two-way process that begins in early childhood education & persists through high school.

The Power of Parent Involvement

Why is Family Engagement Important?

Research shows that involving families in their children's education is paramount to student success. When families are meaningfully and continuously engaged in their children's learning and development, it has a positive impact on their child's health, academic, and well-being outcomes. Furthermore, numerous studies have shown that family involvement can benefit all students, especially those less likely to succeed in school.

Karen L. Mapp, Ed.D., is a senior lecturer on education at the Harvard Graduate School of Education (HGSE) and the faculty Director of the Education Policy and Management Master's Program.
