





What impact does media have on society? If this question gets you thinking, you might want to apply for our summer internship program.

Teen Transmitters at The Paley Center for Media is a 100-hour paid summer internship for rising 11th and 12th grade students who attend New York City public high schools. Interns will take a deep dive into media literacy and explore how the words, sounds, and images they encounter every day make an impression on them. In addition to studying the media landscape, interns will find out what it means to be a media maker by producing their own podcast series! Industry professionals, journalists, documentarians, and podcast producers will be invited to speak to the students about their career paths and act as mentors over the course of the program. Interns will gain skills in public speaking, interviewing, research, writing, and audio production that are crucial for college and career readiness.


