Operations as of 6/20/22

- Benefits Renewal For Board Approval:
 - WCHS received Oxford/UHC benefits plans renewal quote showing a 22% price increase
 - Broker competitively bid the plans and was able to finalize the renewal at an 11% price increase, which did not substantially differ from the increases for plans from other carriers
 - Board Committee will recommend Board approval
 - Renewal maintains consistency for faculty/staff:
 - Maintain benefits plans/networks
 - Does not increase out-of-pocket costs
 (deductibles/co-pays) or employee portion of benefits premium (semi-monthly payroll deduction)

Operations as of 6/20/22

- Requesting Board Approval: WCHS will renew existing benefit plans as is and absorb the cost of the premium increase for each plan level for 2022-23 with the following understandings:
 - Employees who keep their same plan level will <u>not</u> see a change in their semi-monthly benefits payroll deduction
 - WCHS HR Manager will create a 3-5 year plan to contain benefits premium costs exploring the following options:
 - Gradually increasing the employee contribution to the plans and/or changing carriers or plan designs
 - Establishing Health Savings Accounts and/or Health Retirement Accounts to encourage tax-free employee health contributions
 - Level-funding (similar to self-insuring but for mid-size businesses)
 - Joining a PEO or establishing a consortium





COVID-19 Data by Zip Code as of 6/20/22



COVID-19 Vaccination Rate as of 6/20/22



COVID Safety & Emergency Preparedness Updates

- Students whose family consented to be tested continue to receive weekly PCR testing provided by NYC DOE. Our current testing allotment is 86 students per week.
- As cases rise again across New York City, the NYC DOE will be providing every student with four COVID-19 home tests each week until further notice. Two tests are for students and two are for a family member to use.
- We continue to submit COVID numbers to NYS Department of Health daily.

COVID Recommendations (High):

- Wear a mask.
- Get vaccinated and boosted.
- Stay home when sick.
- Get tested.
- Consider other precautions, such as avoiding crowds, limiting gatherings to a small number of people, increasing ventilation, and wearing a higher quality mask. This is especially important for people who are at increased risk due to age, underlying medical condition, or because they are unvaccinated.






Facilities - Facade Option 1
