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## CDC Local COVID-19 Transmission as of 8/9/21





• 90% of tested cases in NYC were the Delta variant as per www1.nyc.gov



## **COVID-positivity as of 8/8/21**



#### Reopening Fall 2021

Output the present guidelines from CDC for schools, we anticipate the following safety measures until otherwise directed by NYC DOH, NYS, and/or the WCHS Board:

- Prioritize in-person learning 5 days a week for all students
- Remote option available if determined by the school to be in the best educational interest of the student
- Approximately 3 feet social distancing whenever possible
- Masks must be worn at all times in the school
- Daily COVID-symptom screening form must be completed by everyone prior to entering the building
- Continued frequent disinfecting and cleaning of high touch surfaces
- Ventilation in classrooms
- Onsite Nurse and coordination with NYC DOH Test & Trace Corps
- NYCDOE routine student COVID-19 screening testing when available
- Encourage COVID-19 vaccinations for anyone ages 12+

# **COVID Safety & Emergency Preparedness Updates**

- Walgreens is still not able to accommodate us for an on-site vaccination program due to unanticipated increase in demand. We will continue to seek additional opportunities.
- We have met wth NYC DOH to request a mobile vaccine pop-up van. Although the are currently booked through August, they will keep us updated on availability.
- We have met with BRI, a community health organization offering mobile vaccination sites at charter schools; More info to come
- Working on a COVID-19 Vaccine promotion and education campaign



# **Recruitment and Enrollment as of 8/12/21**

- ASK: For Approval- Add \$14,520 to the Recruitment Budget for Hot 97 Morning Show Ad Campaign (M-F 6am-10am)
  - Hot97 reaches over 240,000 Black & Latino households with children 12+ in Brooklyn
  - Starting 8/23 running for 4 weeks through 9/13
  - 60 spots: (5) 30second ads and (10) 15 second ads each week
  - 901,500 General Impressions per week for a total of 3,606,000
