







COVID-positivity rate as of 9/16/21



COVID-positivity as of 9/16/21


• 7-day average in 11206 Zip Code= 3.62% (from 9/6-9/12/21) per www1.nyc.gov


Reopening Fall 2021

Output the present guidelines from CDC for schools, we anticipate the following safety measures until otherwise directed by NYC DOH, NYS, and/or the WCHS Board:

- Prioritize in-person learning 5 days a week for all students
- Remote option available if determined by the school to be in the best educational interest of the student
- Approximately 3 feet social distancing whenever possible
- Masks must be worn at all times in the school
- Daily COVID-symptom screening form must be completed by everyone prior to entering the building
- Continued frequent disinfecting and cleaning of high touch surfaces
- Ventilation in classrooms
- Onsite Nurse and coordination with NYC DOH Test & Trace Corps
- NYCDOE weekly student COVID-19 screening testing coming soon
- Encourage COVID-19 vaccinations for anyone ages 12+

COVID Safety & Emergency Preparedness Updates

- Submitting to the NYS COVID Report Card Portal Daily
- Met with BioReference Labs to begin implementation of NYC DOE Student COVID-19 Screening Testing Program
 - Weekly (was biweekly but will now be weekly) testing of 10% of unvaccinated students with consent forms
 - Onsite PCR, short nasal swab test with results in 48hrs

- Creating forms for mandated vaccination status collection for staff and high risk sports
- We have met with NYC DOH to request a mobile vaccine pop-up van. Although the are currently booked through August, they will keep us updated on availability.
- We have met with BRI, a community health organization offering mobile vaccination sites at charter schools; more info to come

Facilities

The start of the school year 2021-2022 a total of three (3) Air Conditioning compressors had to be replaced. We have been able to reduce the numbers from 4 to 8 units per year from 2014 through 2016 to 1 to 3 units from 2017 to 2022 due to an upgraded maintenance & service plan with Anthony Cooling Inc and with the assistance of schools Facilities Department we have been able to maintain the conditions of the compressors





Facilities

At this time the school's roof is in need of repair due to wear, tear and inclimate weather. The drainage system will also need revision. The summer of 2022 would be ideal in conducting this project upon the boards approval.




