





7-day rolling average in NYC = 1.55% (as of 11/8/21) per www1.nyc.gov



COVID-positivity as of 11/10/21



Reopening Fall 2021

Under the present guidelines from CDC for schools, we anticipate the following safety measures until otherwise directed by NYC DOH, NYS, and/or the WCHS Board:

- Prioritize in-person learning 5 days a week for all students
- Remote option available if determined by the school to be in the best educational interest of the student
- Approximately 3 feet social distancing whenever possible
- Masks must be worn at all times in the school
- Daily COVID-symptom screening form must be completed by everyone prior to entering the building
- Continued frequent disinfecting and cleaning of high touch surfaces
- Ventilation in classrooms
- Onsite Nurse and coordination with NYC DOH Test & Trace Corps
- NYCDOE weekly student COVID-19 screening testing
- Encourage COVID-19 vaccinations for anyone ages 5+

COVID Safety & Emergency Preparedness

Updates

- Submitting to the NYS COVID Report Card Portal Daily
- BioReference Labs began implementation of NYC DOE Student COVID-19 Screening Testing Program 10/15/21.
 - Testing approximately 25-35 students per week
 - Weekly (was biweekly but will now be weekly) testing of 10% of unvaccinated students with consent forms
 - Onsite PCR, short nasal swab test with results in 48hrs
 - https://vimeo.com/468963042
- Conducted mandated vaccination status collection for staff and high risk sports. All staff
 members at WCHS have now had at least one dose of the COVID-19 vaccine.
- We have met with NYC DOH to request a mobile vaccine pop-up van.
- Working on a COVID-19 Vaccine promotion and education campaign



Safety

- Five student incidents reported at the school for the month
- Two incidents reported off property
- One NYPD visits to the school for the month
- Daily temperature screening was conducted for , Students, Staff & Visitors
- One student bag checks were conducted with minor findings
- One Safety Officer termination
- New Safety Officer candidate's screening presently ongoing



Facilities

1-Facilities has converted the building to heat.

2-Repairs made to water leak in buildings cellar. No further issues reported.

3-Air filters are being replaced
