



# COVID-19 New Case rate as of 5/12/22





# COVID-19 Data by Zip Code as of 5/12/22



# **COVID-19 Vaccination Rate as of 5/12/22**



### **COVID Safety & Emergency Preparedness Updates**


- Students whose family consented to be tested continue to receive weekly PCR testing provided by NYC DOE. Our current testing allotment is 86 students per week.
- As cases rise again across New York City, the NYC DOE will be providing every student with four COVID-19 home tests each week until further notice. Two tests are for students and two are for a family member to use.
- We continue to submit COVID numbers to NYS Department of Health daily.


#### **COVID Recommendations (High):**

- Wear a mask.




#### **FACILITIES**



# Accountability Open Meetings Law

# Provision 103-a

Law goes into effect June 9, 2022 (expires July 1, 2024) - schools may meet remotely prior to June 9 so long as public has ability to view or listen to such proceeding and that such meetings are recorded and later transcribed

# Videoconferencing Rules New 103-a

- Public Officers Law 103-a(2): "A public body may, in its discretion, use videoconferencing to conduct its meetings pursuant to the requirements of this article provided that a minimum number of members are present to fulfill the public body's quorum requirement in the same physical location or locations where the public can attend..."
- Members can participate by videoconference (will not count for quorum, but can vote) must meet "extraordinary circumstances," that is defined in the resolution and written procedures.
  - Examples include disability, illness, caregiving responsibilities, or any other significant or unexpected factor or event which precludes the member's physical attendance.
- The requirements "in person" participation requirements "shall not apply during a state disaster emergency declared by the governor pursuant to section twenty-eight of the executive law, or a local state of emergency proclaimed by the chief executive of a county, city, village or town pursuant to section twenty-four of the executive law, if the public body determines that the circumstances necessitating the emergency declaration would affect or impair the ability of the public body to hold an in person meeting."



### Accountability and Development

#### **Accountability**

**Approval:** Motion allowing resolution allowing the use of OML Provision 103-a in order to allow the use of videoconferencing flexibilities.

#### WCHS Open Meetings Law Provision 103-a Resolution

WCHS will utilize OML Provision 103-a and that this provision includes:

- WCHS Trustees who are remote will be identified in the meeting minutes and be heard/seen/identified.
- Meeting notice will include that videoconferencing will be available, and will detail where the public can view and/or participate and where require documents and records will be posted/available.
- WCHS will record and post Board of Trustees meeting within five business days on website and make it available for a minimum of five years. Meetings will be transcribed upon request.
- Members of the public will be able to participate via videoconference and participate the same as if they
  were in person.
- WCHS will utilize videoconferencing technology that will allow access by members of the public with disabilities consistent with the 1990 Americans with Disabilities Act and corresponding guidelines.
- WCHS will define "extraordinary circumstances" as disability, illness, medical reason, caregiving responsibilities, and/or travel relating to themselves or a family member, or any other significant or unexpected factor or event which precludes the trustee's physical attendance.

# Accountability and Development

#### <u>Accountability</u>

- **Midterm Site Visit -** NYS CSO will be visiting in-person on **June 10** from 8am-5pm. This is our first in-person visit since school renewal. Pre-visit collection documents were submitted on May 6.
- The Board of Regents approved for Emergency Action at its May meeting a temporary expansion of the existing process to **appeal to graduate with a lower score on a Regents Examination.** The purpose of this expansion is to provide flexibility to students taking Regents Examinations in the 2021-22 and 2022-23 school years in meeting assessment requirements for a diploma.
  - Eligibility Conditions for the Special Appeal
    - The student must have taken the Regents exam during the June 2022, August 2022, January 2023, June 2023 or August 2023 test administration periods.
    - The student must have a score of 50-64 on the Regents Examination that is the subject of the appeal and was taken during one of the above administrations.
    - The student has attained a course average in the course that meets or exceeds the required passing grade by the school and is recorded on the student's official transcript with grades achieved by the student in each quarter of the school year.
- Worked with CSBM to complete revisions to ARP-Homeless Children and Youth Grant. This was approved on May 11.
