Academics–Remote Option Information

WCHS values the benefits of in-person learning.

<u>Unless otherwise changed by NYSED</u>, school districts can create fully remote options as long as it is in the educational best interest of the student.

Remote Learning Application Process:

- 1. Parents and guardians must submit a <u>written request</u> to their student's Academy Leader describing why remote learning is in the best educational interest of their child.
- 2. The student's Academy Leader will review the request form and Mr. Bashir will determine whether the student is eligible for remote learning.
- 3. Parents and guardians will be notified whether or not their student is permitted to participate in the remote learning program and must sign a <u>Remote Learning Contract</u> if approved.





COVID-19 Data by Zip Code as of 9/25/22


7-day percent positive from 9/14-9/20 in Zip code 11206 =5.6% per www1.nyc.gov





COVID-19 Vaccination Rate as of 9/25/22


• % Population in 11206 Zip Code = 61.97% at vaccinated per www1.nyc.gov



Accountability and Development

Citywide test results from grades 3-8 assessments released

- Fewer than 38% of 3-8 students demonstrated proficiency in math, compared with 46% before pandemic
- Results show that students who were already behind before pandemic fared worse as education was disrupted, particularly Hispanic students
- Overall, about 21% of NYC's bLack students and about 23% of Hispanic students passed this year's math exam, compared with 59% of white students and 68% of Asian American students. Pass rates for each group were more than six points lower than their peers in 2019, while Hispanic students scored nearly 10% lower.
- Fewer than ¹/₈ students with disabilities passed either test.
