We presently have 2 Safety Officer vacancies and 1 on leave and are requesting approval to contract with JC Protection to solve the immediate need. They service many schools in all 5 boroughs and understand our needs. Once we do fill the vacancies, we would like to continue to contract with JC Protection (should we be satisfied with their services in the next 12 weeks) to supply us with 2 officers daily to cover daily absences.

3 Bids:

- 1-JC Protection\$26.00 per hour
- 2-Sentinel Security\$28.50 per hour
- 3-Allied Security\$27.00 per hour

From JC Protection:

The proposal priced out for 3 officers at 40 hours per week of service each for 12 weeks. As discussed, after this 3 month trial, the School will be interested in contracted JC Protection for a 1 year service agreement if satisfied with service




Recommended actions based on current level



COVID-19 Data by Zip Code as of 10/17/22



COVID-19 Vaccination Rate as of 10/17/22


% Population in 11206 Zip Code = 61.97% at vaccinated per www1.nyc.gov

We received proposals from Allied Universal & Sentinel Security. We will provide the required on the job training for the outsourced company. 


